At the end of the war, Farnham College of Art provided pottery classes for the general public.

From 1961 to 1977 these classes were held at 69b West Street, and from 1977 to 1998 classes were held at the College Foundation Buildings, also in West Street; it was from here that the first exhibition took place at the Maltings in 1984, and it was at this exhibition that the name West Street Potters was first used.

In 1998, the West Surrey College of Art and Design, now the Surrey Institute of Art and Design University College (S.I.A.D.), decided to close the classes due to re-organisation at the main College: at the same time, The Farnham Building Trust, bought for renovation the Harris Pottery at Wrecclesham, now a Grade II Listed building.

West Street Potters negotiated with the Trust for new premises, and with the blessing of S.I.A.D. has relocated, as a Limited Company to Wrecclesham.

We are an enthusiastic, committed group of potters. We are fortunate to have as our tutors, Katrina Evangelidou and Julia Quigley, both highly regarded and professional ceramicists. Under their guidance we aim for excellence and are eager to welcome new members to share our ideas and ambitions for the future.
